Fairs and Festivals

You might have seen the Lambhill Stables team out and about at various fairs, festivals and fun days across the North of Glasgow this summer.

We took the time to tell people about the project, and to do some willow weaving to promote the work we have already done in the community garden.

It was really encouraging to speak to so many local people who are passionate about Lambhill Stables becoming a great hub for the community.

The Community Garden

A willow tunnel, or 'fedge' was planted in the spring with help from local schools pupils and local people. It now forms most of the boundary between the community gardens and the wildlife reserve beyond.

What's New?

Lambhill Stables Open Day and AGM! Come along to St Agnes Church at 1pm on Sunday 16th November: see overleaf.

Full Planning Permission Granted! Lambhill Stables has been granted full planning and listed building consent. This is a major milestone for the delivery of the project.

Funding secured for Community Gardens! Lambhill Stables has received funding from GCC's Landfill Communities Fund for the delivery of our Community Gardens! This will be our first major development project and we are keen to involve as many local people and community groups as possible.

The Antonine Wall, which runs just north of Cadder and Possil, has been named a UN heritage site.

Art Project. Pupils from St Joan of Arc, Springburn and Drumchapel High Schools took part in creating art around the themes of Lambhill Stables and the canal. These fantastic paintings have recently been displayed in the Coach House Trust on Belmont Street, and will be shown again at the open day.

We are very grateful to Community Planning for a recent grant which enables further preparation and design work on the Lambhill Stables building.
